Conference Themes	
Theme 1	How to drive sustainable & predictable organisational performance - understanding what causes the ‘disconnect’ between business strategy and daily outcomes. Papers presented under this theme will explore international research and experience demonstrating the inextricable link between organisational performance and organisational alignment and how to manage it.
Theme 2	Connectivity - identifying what you will need to develop a technical infrastructure capable of supporting the business needs of your organisation. Papers presented under this theme will include an understanding of the data architecture required to minimise the time spent by users on clinical and management reporting; understanding how information architecture will need to be developed for organisations to integrate with HealthConnect; and an examination of the current and emerging technology that may need to be supported by your technical infrastructure.
Theme 3	Improving the delivery of healthcare with better continuity and quality of care, consumer safety and health outcomes for older Australians - Papers presented under this theme will examine how the needs of older Australians including the healthy aged and the frail elderly are being or will be catered for under Australia’s national electronic health record network, HealthConnect. Presentations will explore how this is likely to impact clinical decision-making in aged care, exchange of information between aged care and health care service providers and importantly how it will contribute to building a best practice, evidence based system of health and wellness care for older Australians.
